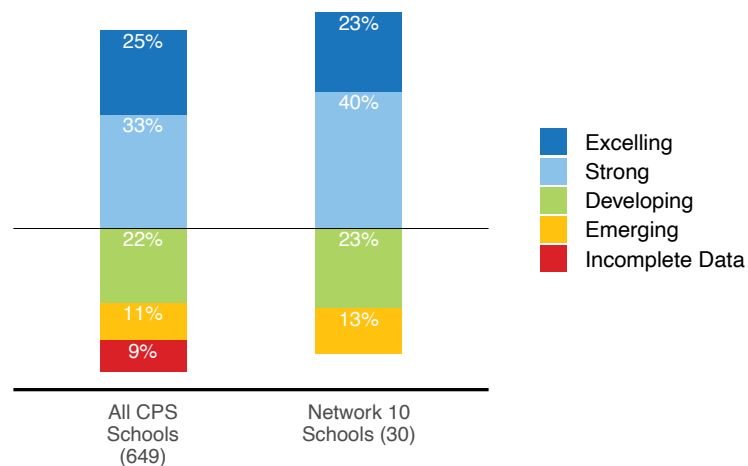

Creative Schools Certification

Creative Schools Supports

Depending on a school's Certification ratings, they may be eligible for a range of Creative Schools supports. All three of these resources represent investments directly to schools to support arts priorities. These are paired with district investments to provide complementary supports that can increase the impact for teachers and schools.

Arts Essentials Fund

- Administered by CPS Department of Arts Education
- Automatically loaded into school budgets
- \$1,000 per school to go towards arts materials and supplies

Creative Teachers Fund

- Administered by CPS Department of Arts Education
- Teacher funding to support instructional priorities within the arts
- Focus areas include integration with Skyline curriculum, Professional Learning, and Instructional Coaching

Creative Schools Fund

- Administered by Ingenuity
- Funded by Ingenuity, CPS, and Mayor's Office
- Allocated through a competitive granting process
- All schools may apply for **Residencies and Student Experiences**: arts partnerships
- Select schools may apply for additional opportunities based on their Certification scores; participation is through an invitation-only process
 - **Minutes of Instruction**: for elementary schools to increase towards 120 minutes of arts instruction weekly
 - **Disciplines and Depth**: for high schools to increase the number, or deepen the level, of disciplines in their school
 - **Dedicated Arts Spaces**: for schools to make physical improvements to schools in support of arts access

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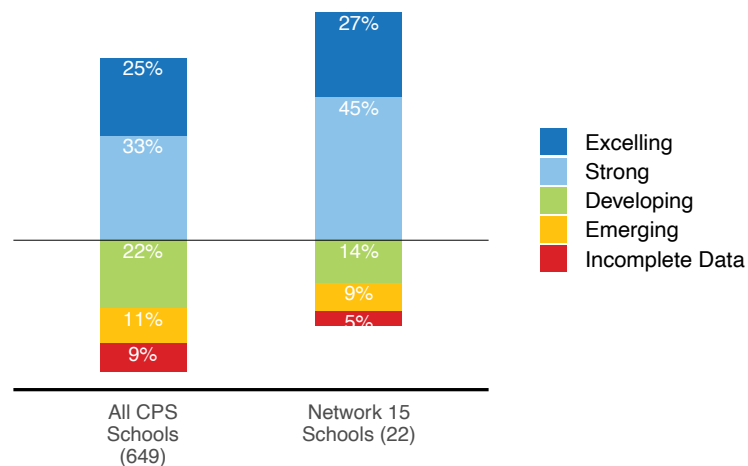
