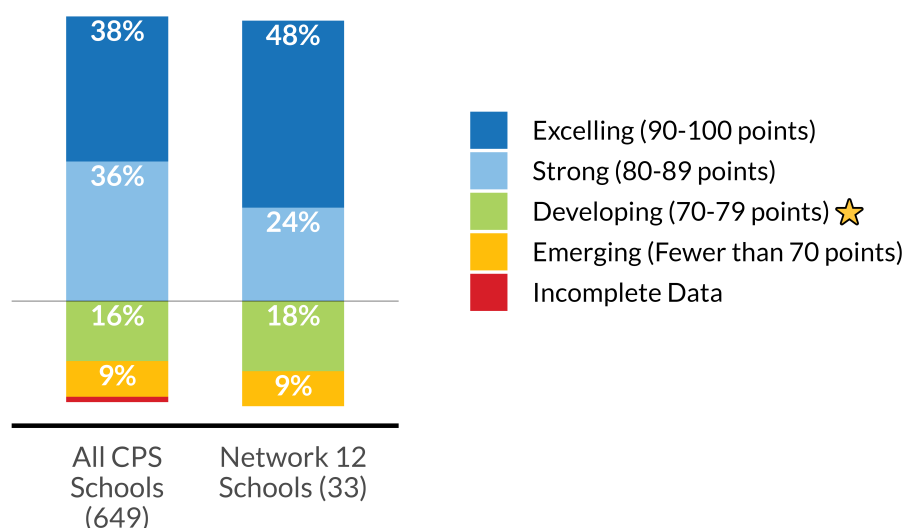

Access Metrics

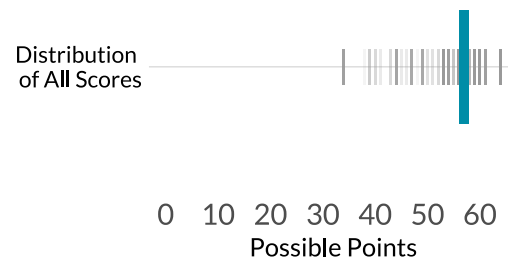

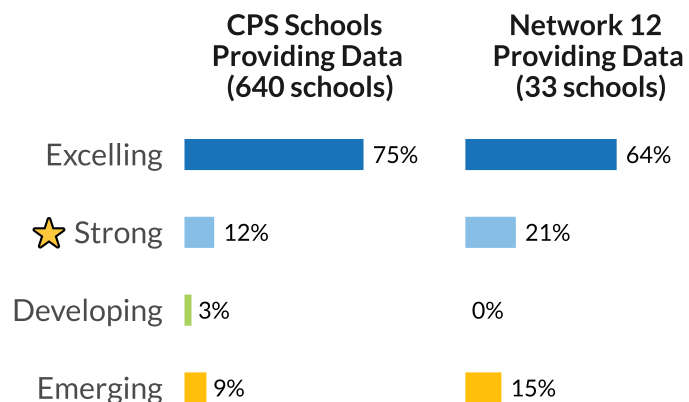

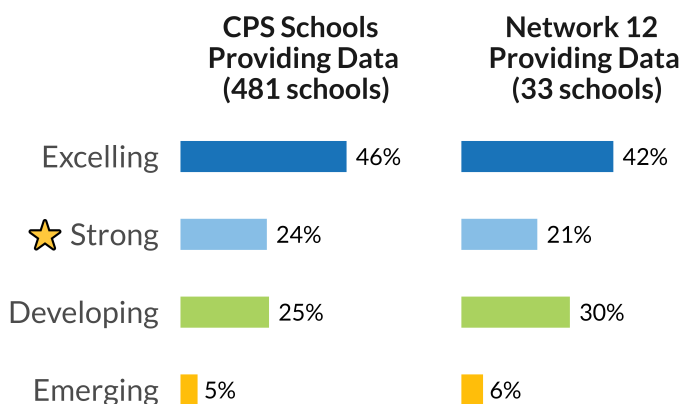

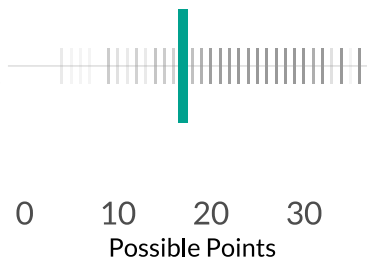
Quality Elements

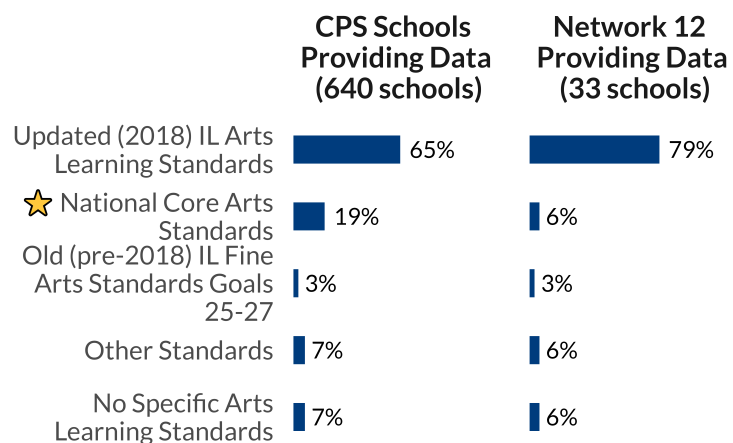

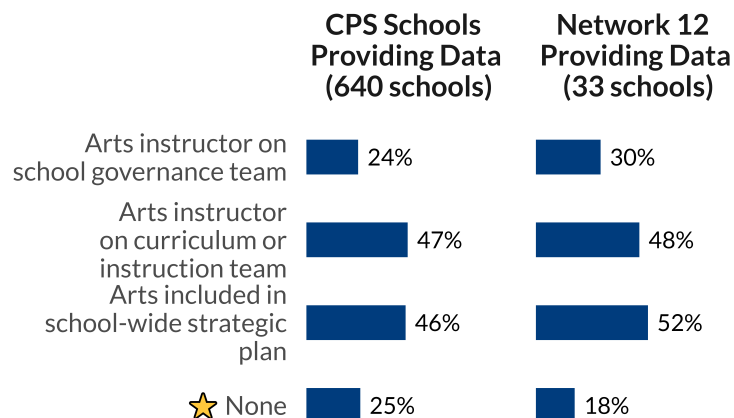

Planning for Subsequent School Years

CPS Elementary School received a total of 74 points with a final CSC rating of **Developing (70-79 points)**. Your school is 6 points away from achieving the next higher rating of **Strong**. To be rated as **Excelling**, your school needs an additional 16 points. **Excelling** schools are those that meet the goals and priorities outlined in the [2012 CPS Arts Education Plan](#).

To improve your rating for the 2024-25 school year or plan for the 2025-26 school year, assuming all else holds equal, we have compiled the following recommendations to consider.

Staffing Ratio	Your school reported a total of 1 Arts Teacher for every 390 students based on an enrollment of 390. In order to receive full points, a school must have a ratio of 1 Arts Teacher for every 350 students or better. <i>(Note that a smaller ratio is better)</i>	3
