# What is the Purpose of this Document?


Ingenuity and the CPS Department of Arts Education are pleased to present **CPS High School** with your 2022-23 Creative Schools Roadmap. This report provides you with your summative Creative Schools Certification (CSC) rating and is based on the data you reported on the Creative Schools Survey in the fall of 2023.

# **Creative Schools Certification**

**CPS High School** received a total of **91 points** (out of 100) on the CSC. This translates to a final CSC category rating of **Excelling (90-100 points)**. The chart below shows how this compares to other schools in the district and in Network 15.

### **Access**

### **Disciplines and Depth**

# **Planning for Subsequent School Years**

CPS High School received a total of 91 points with a final CSC rating of Excelling (90-100 points). **Excelling** schools are those that meet the goals and priorities outlined in the CPS Arts Education Plan.

While your school was rated as Excelling for 2022-23, to maintain your rating for the 2023-24 school year and plan for the 2024-25 school year, assuming all else holds equal, we have compiled the following recommendations to consider. Arts Essentials Fund: Awarded to all schools that complete the Creative Schools Survey	
Materials & Supplies	\$1000 loaded into schools budgets to support the purchase of materials and supplies specifically for arts courses.





Creative Schools Fund: School-Level Opportunities	
Partnerships (Open and competitive grants process)	Arts residencies and student learning experiences, including field trips and professional learning, conducted in partnership with an arts organization.
Minutes of Instruction Elementary Schools Only (Invitation only process)	A scheduling consultancy to support revisions to Master Schedules that bring schools closer to meeting the recommended 120 minutes weekly average of arts instruction.
Disciplines and Depth High Schools Only (Invitation only process)	Curriculum consultancy, teacher skills development, planning and supplies to expand disciplines and depth.
Dedicated Arts Spaces (Invitation only process)	Improving the spaces in the school to increase arts access.
